Award by the Ormond Strong organization during their Family Appreciation Day event. DAV Represented at VVA's National Vietnam War Veterans Day Commemoration

On March 29 we commemorate the anniversary of the last US combat troops departing Vietnam. On this day, we recognize and honor our nation's veterans and their families for their service and sacrifice. And a full house of about 100 veterans and family members from Volusia County's numerous veterans organizations attended the Vietnam Veterans of America (VVA) Chapter 1048's commemoration.

The invocation was given by Port Orange City Council Member, Chase Tramont, and the presentation of colors was done by the VVA's color guard who will also be presenting the colors at the Memorial Day Heroes Honor Festival in Daytona Beach. Various persons and organizations in attendance were recognized by emcee and VVA Chapter 1048 President, Robert Adkins. Included among those introduced were DAV #84 Board Member and West Volusia MOAA Chapter President, Ray Parker, and his wife, Florida State DAV Auxiliary Commander, Claudia Parker. Adkins then introduced Port Orange Mayor Donald Burnette who welcomed home all Vietnam Veterans with a "thank you" for our country's freedom and a proclamation declaring the day in their

honor. A monetary gift was presented to the VVA by Progressive Medical Research in Port Orange, a strong supporter of veteran activities in the area.

Florida Congressman Tom Wright gave his thanks, congratulations, support, and encouragement to the Vietnam Veterans, and discussed his efforts and those of his colleagues in Florida government to better the lives of all Florida veterans.

Back by popular demand was last year's speaker and Cybersecurity professor at Embry-

Riddle Aeronautical University, Colonel Kim Ramos, USAF (Ret). Ramos' presentation was a discussion of internet security with an emphasis on INsecurity and protecting computers and phones in today's volatile environment. Graciously, Colonel Ramos and two additional cybersecurity specialists devoted their time following the presentation and after the luncheon to assist attendees in securing their mobile phones.

VVA President Bob Atkins closed the meeting noting it was "...one of the most successful events in their history..." and that the VVA looks forward to commemorating National Vietnam War Veterans Day in future years with other local veterans organizations.

VA will propose adding rare cancers to the presumed service-connected list as related to military environmental exposure

WASHINGTON — The Department of Veterans Affairs intends to propose adding certain rare respiratory cancers to the list of <u>presumed service-connected disabilities</u> in relation to military environ-

mental exposure to particulate matter.

VA determined through a focused review of scientific and medical evidence there is biologic plausibility between airborne hazards, specifically particulate matter, and carcinogenesis of the respiratory tract, and that the unique circumstances of these rare cancers warrant a presumption of service connection.

Based on these findings, VA's Secretary is proposing a rule that will add presumptive service connection for several rare respiratory cancers for certain Veterans. The cancers under consideration include:

- Squamous cell carcinoma of the larynx.
- Squamous cell carcinoma of the trachea.
- Adenocarcinoma of the trachea.
- Salivary gland-type tumors of the trachea.
- Adenosquamous carcinoma of the lung.
- Large cell carcinoma of the lung.
- Salivary gland-type tumors of the lung.
- Sarcomatoid carcinoma of the lung.
- Typical and atypical carcinoid of the lung.

"This is the right decision. The rarity and severity of these illnesses, and the reality that these conditions present a situation where it may not be possible to develop additional evidence prompted us to take this critical action," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "We'll continue to hold ourselves accountable to Veterans to provide more care, more benefits and more services to more Veterans than ever before."

VA intends to focus its rule on the rare respiratory cancers above in Veterans who served any amount of time in the Southwest Asia theater of operations and other locations. VA will invite and consider public comments as part of this process.

Once rulemaking is complete, VA will conduct outreach to impacted veterans and survivors to inform them about potential eligibility.
